



SABRINA RHINEHART, JD, is the Director for the Office of the Mental Health Advocate (OMHA) at the Georgia Public Defender Council. This agency monitors and/or represents all cases in which a criminal defendant is found Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity in the State of Georgia. In addition, the Office represents those individuals found Incompetent to Stand trial on a limited basis and provides assistance to other criminal defense attorneys who represent mentally ill clients.

Sabrina conducts seminars aimed at bridging the gap between the criminal process and the mental health system. She has served on many committees including the Chief Justice Led Task Force to Promote Criminal Justice and Mental Health, the Georgia Appleseed Foundation, the Criminal Justice and Developmentally Disabled Coalition, and the Behavioral Health Region 3 Mental Health Summit where she co-chaired the Mental Health Court Subcommittee, the Fulton County Justice and Mental Health Task Force, and the National Public Defender Mental Health Coalition.

Sabrina's experience includes work as a public Defender in Houston and Fulton Counties, as well as, private practice with a focus on criminal and domestic law prior to working with OMHA.
